You must have your biometric features recorded within 14 days after your application has been submitted.

You must appear in person to have your biometric features (facial photo and fingerprints) recorded for use in the residence card. This must be done within **14 days** after your application has been submitted. The processing of the application will only begin when the biometric features have been received by the Danish Agency for International Recruitment and Integration.

IMPORTANT: You must **bring a print of this receipt** when your biometric features are to be recorded. We need your case order ID and application form type in order to match the biometric data with the online application. You must also **bring your passport** or equivalent travel documentation.

In addition to your biometric features, your signature will also be recorded. The facial photo and fingerprints are stored on a microchip embedded in the residence card issued to you if you are granted a residence permit.

If you do not agree to have your biometric features recorded in connection with the application being submitted, your application will be rejected. However, if you are not physically capable of providing fingerprints, you will not be required to do so.

Where can I have my biometric features recorded?

Biometric features can be recorded in the Citizen Centre of the Danish Agency for International Recruitment and Integration. If you live outside Greater Copenhagen, your biometric features can be recorded at local police stations. If you live outside Denmark, your biometric features can be recorded at certain Danish diplomatic missions and outsourcing bureaus. A list of places where you can have your biometric features recorded is available here.
